NOTICE OF REGATTA

- 1. Rules: This regatta will be governed by *The Racing Rules of Sailing* for 2005-2008, the prescriptions of the US Sailing Association, and the rules of the United States Albacore Association, except as any of these are altered by this notice, and by the sailing instructions.
- 2. Eligibility and Entry: All boats must be helmed by a full or associate member of the United States Albacore Association or any other national Albacore Association. Members may register to compete either in the Presidents Fleet or the Challenger Fleet, with placed winners of previous USAA and international championships excluded from competing in the latter. This championship will be a Category A event as it relates to advertising.

3. Number and Schedule of Races

Several races may be sailed on any day at the discretion of the race committee (no upper limit). The warning signal for the first race each day scheduled as indicated below:

1200 Warning for Race 1, Presidents Fleet

Warning for Race 1, Challenger Fleet, will follow:

other races to follow as appropriate

Awards immediately following racing. No race will be started after 1400 on Monday Oct 13.

- **8. Measurement:** All boats must be accompanied by a valid measurement certificate with a current buoyancy endorsement. All boats must comply with the specifications for this event. No provision will be made for issuing new measurement certificates or endorsements at the regatta. All measurement must be complete in advance of the event.
- 9. Safety Equipment: Each boat must carry safety equipment according to US Coast Guard Regulations (1 PFD per person, sound signal, paddle, bailer). In addition, each boat must carry on board during the regatta a line, suitable for towing, at least 1/4" x 30 feet in length.
- **10. Sailing Instructions:** Sailing instructions will be available at the check-in/late registration table and may be posted online by Sep 1, 2008 at the U.S. Albacore Association website. SIs will govern in case of any inconsistency with this NOR.
- **11. Scoring:** The low point system of Appendix A of the RRS will apply except (in summary): DNF boats will be treated as tied for the position immediately behind the last boat to finish correctly; boats failing to start correctly will be awarded points equal to number of starters plus one. Completion of at least one race shall constitute a series. One drop race if 6 or more races are sailed.
- **12. Crew Changes:** Crew changes during an event may not be made unless permission is granted by the organizing committee in advance.
- **13. Awards:** There will be awards for the Presidents Fleet and the Challenger Fleet.
 - Presidents Trophy- Winner of the President's Fleet
 - Bob Harwood Challenge Trophy- Winner of the Challenger Fleet
 - Roger Thomas Senior Trophy- Top boat with combined crew age > 100 years
 - · Bill Shore Trophy- Top Woman helm
 - Lockley-Newport Trophy- Top helm 19 years or under as of Dec 31, 2008
 - Endurance Award- Lowest placing boat that starts every race in the Presidents Fleet
 - Most Improved Award- for greatest improvement in overall position from 2006 U.S Nationals
 - Against All Odds Award- for top placing boat using personal handicap system
 - Six Pack Award –Three boats from the same club (two boats compete in the presidents fleet and one in the challenger fleet) compete for the best combined score.
