SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the 2005-2008 *Racing Rules of Sailing*. The organizing authority is Treasure Island Sailing Center. Youth sailors in Optimist RWB, Optimist Green, C420, CFJ, Laser, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7 fleets will be raced in accordance with the BAYS series NOR.

2. ENTRIES

Competitors may enter by completing registration at the regatta registration desk at TISC on Saturday morning June 21st, or by faxing registration materials to 415.421.2208.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board on the east side of the Vanguard 15 storage shed at the Treasure Island Sailing Center. Course Bravo RC may communicate with competitors on VHF Channel 78 anytime after 0930 on race days. Failure to hear VHF coms will not be grounds for redress.

4. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the day it will take effect and changes may occur on the water by the Signal Boat hailing said changes.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located to the west of the TISC dinghy launch ramp. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after AP is lowered for Course Alpha, and 60 minutes for Course Bravo.

6. SCHEDULE

7. CLASS FLAGS AND STARTING ORDER

Class flags shall reflect the sail insignia of each class.

Optimist Green Fleet class flag will be a green flag with a white insignia. Optimist Red, Blue, and White will be a white flag with a green insignia.

Laser class flag will be a red flag with a white insignia, Laser Radial will be a white flag with a red insignia, 4.7 will be a blue flag with the number "4.7" on it.

The starting order for the first race of each day shall be:

Alpha- C420, CFJ, 4.7, Optimist

Bravo- J24, Flying Dutchman, Vanguard 15, Snipe, Finn, Laser, Laser Radial

8. RACING AREAS

Racing for CFJ, C420, Laser 4.7, and Optimist (RBW and Green) fleets will take place on Course Alpha (Clipper Cove).

Racing for J24, Flying Dutchman, Snipe, Laser, Laser Radial, Finn, and Vanguard 15 fleets will take place on Course Bravo (Emeryville Flats), approximately 1.3nm Northeast of Clipper Cove.

9. COURSE AND MARKS

See Appendix A. Courses will be signaled by numeral pennant. All marks shall be left to port. On Course Bravo marks 1, 2, 3, 5 will be yellow inflatables. Marks 1(b) and 4 will be orange inflatables. Course Alpha marks will be orange and white hippity hops. Except while starting and/or finishing, the start line and finish line are restricted respectively.

10. THE START

The starting line shall be between Mark S and an orange flag on the Signal Boat.

The Sound Signal System (Appendix Q) shall be used on Courses Alpha and Bravo.

11. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position.

12. THE FINISH

The finish line shall be between Mark F and an orange flag on the Finish Boat.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

For all courses Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gibe, is required.

14. TIME LIMIT

The time limit for each race will be 60 minutes for the first boat to finish. For all races additional time limit shall be 10 minutes after the first boat finishes for courses Alpha and 15 minutes after the first boat finishes for Course Bravo. Boats finishing after this will be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35.

15. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

A yacht's protests and requests for redress shall be delivered to the TISC desk within 30 minutes after the race committee finish boat from her course docks. The list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after protests are received.

16. SCORING

Three races shall be completed to constitute a series. If six races or more are completed a boat may throw out her worst score. This changes RRS A2. The total number of races shall be left at the discretion of the race committee. No more than twelve races will be raced, six per day.

17. CHECK INS

All sailors shall check in by hailing the race committee signal boat prior to the first race of the day and a retiring sailor shall attempt to notify the race committee of any course. If not practical they shall notify the TISC office as soon as arriving ashore.

18. SAFETY

USCG approved life jackets shall be worn by all competitors while racing. Competitors on Course Bravo are required to carry a towline consistent with their class rules, or at least 20 feet in length.

19. COACHES AND SUPPORT BOATS

Coach and support boats must remain a distance of 75ft from the racing area at all times and shall have no contact with any competitor during racing (except in Optimist Green Fleet). All coach and support boats shall not cause wake in the racing area. Coaching of Opti Green Fleet competitors while racing is permitted, however coaching shall be limited to skippers in the bottom half of the green fleet in any given race.

20. RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

21. AWARDS

Awards shall be made to first, second and third place in each fleet. Participation awards will be given to all Optimist Green Fleet sailors entered in the regatta.
