

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Santana 22 Nationals

July 30- August 1, 2010

1.0 Rules

This Regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing, 2009-2012(RRS), the Santana 22 One design class rules, and by these Sailing Instructions. In the event of any conflicts within these rules, these sailing instructions, and any amendments or attachments to these sailing instructions, shall override the other documents.

2.0 Notice to Competitors

Notice to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board located in the Encinal Yacht Club Bar.

3.0 Changes in Sailing Instructions

Any change in the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0800 on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 1900 hours on the day before it will take effect.

4.0 Signals Made Ashore

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the yard arm at the Encinal Yacht Club.

5.0 Schedule of Race

5.1 Practice Race: Friday July 30, 2010 First Sound: 1300
5.2 Races 1-3: Saturday July 31, 2010 First Sound: 1100
Subsequent Races following the completion of the race before.

5.3 Races 4-5: Sunday August 1, 2010 First Sound: 1100 Subsequent Races following the completion of the race before.

5.4 Races may be added to Sundays schedule if three races are not completed on Saturday.

6.0 Communications

The race committee will use VHF channel 66 for all communications to competitors for this event.

7.0 The Start

- **7.1** Races will be started using RRS 26.
- 7.2 The committee boat will be located approximately 0.5 nautical miles W SW of the end of the Berkeley Pier.
- 7.3 The starting line will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and an orange inflatable mark or orange ball adjacent to the committee boat.
- 7.4 The start/finish line is **not restricted** for this event.

8.0 Marks

Marks are described below:

W Windward Mark: A temporary orange inflatable mark to windward of the

committee boat.

O Offset A temporary orange ball adjacent to W

L Leeward Mark A temporary orange inflatable mark to leeward of the .

committee boat.

S/F Start/Finish Between an orange flag on the race committee boat and an

orange inflatable mark or an orange ball adjacent to the

committee boat.

9.0 Courses

10.0 Protests

Valid protests meeting RRS 61 will be heard at the Encinal Yacht Club on the same day as the race was held. Protests meeting RRS 61 must be filed with an Encinal Race Officer or at the Encinal Yacht Club office no later than one hour after the race committee boat returns to the Encinal Docks.

11.0 Scoring

The low-Point Scoring System, RRS A4 will apply as modified: Five races are scheduled of which two shall be completed to constitute a series. Each boat's total score will be the sum of her scores for all races. For scoring, a boat (OCS or ONF) = series entered +1; (DNS or DNC) = series entered + 2; (DSQ or DNE) = series entered + 3. Scoring will be based on Boat on Boat finishes.

12.0 Awards

An awards ceremony will take place at Encinal Yacht Club, in the Bar, at 1600 hours on Sunday August 1.
